

Discipleship Guide 17th May 2020 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18

This Week's BIG IDEA: In the time between planting the church in Thessalonica and writing Paul's letter, believers had died. The church was disturbed by this reality and had questions for Paul. Paul writes to the church to reassure them of the fate of all believers. There is a hope for all Christians that they will be reunited with other believers when Jesus returns. The basis of all Christian hope is that we worship a person who came back from death thereby setting a precedent for all believers.

CONNECT IN:

Here's some ice breaker questions you might want to use this week:

- What is the one thing you want to accomplish next week?
- If you had a time machine that would work only once, what point in the future, or in the past, would you visit?

CONNECT UP: Fix your eyes on God and give him an opportunity to speak to you through his Word

Starter... Just like Pepper longs to be reunited with Naomi What do your non-Christian friends look forward to? How do they express a long-term hope?

Read the passage 1Thessalonians 4:13-18

- 1. What is the basis of our Christian hope? (4:13-14)
- 2. Among some Christian groups, it is popular to believe that Christians will be secretly raptured from the earth years before Jesus returns. Does what Paul state in vv.15-17 differ from this perspective?
- 3. What sequence of events will happen when Jesus returns (v.16 &17)?
- 4. What do you think the Thessalonians/Purley Baptist were/is meant to do with this teaching? (v.18)

CONNECT OUT as a group to serve the world around you

- 1) How should the promise of Jesus' return shape our beliefs and behaviour as Christians?
- 2) What difference does the hope of Christ's return make to how we think about: (a) personal suffering (b) material things?
